



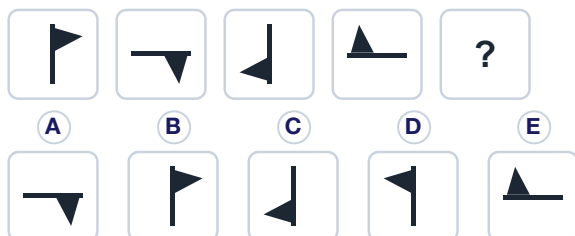

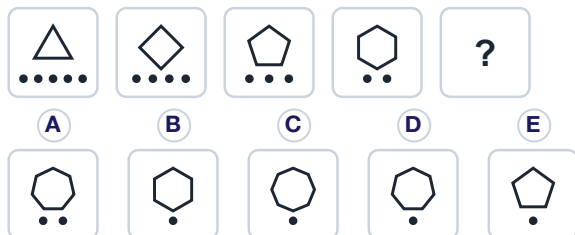

The four squares change by the same rule each step. Choose what comes next.

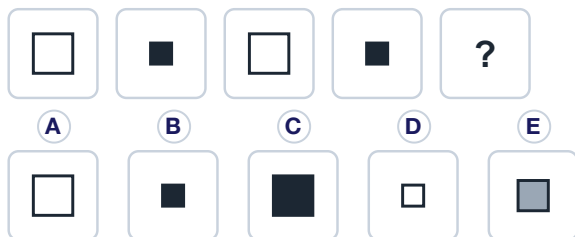

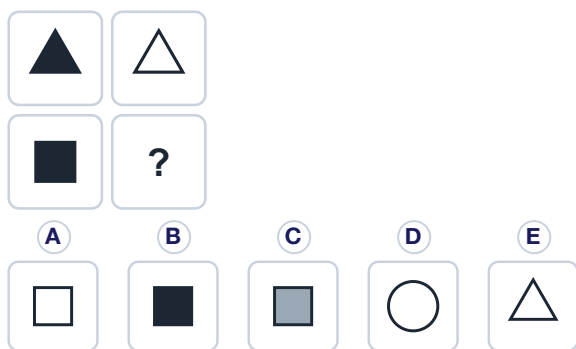

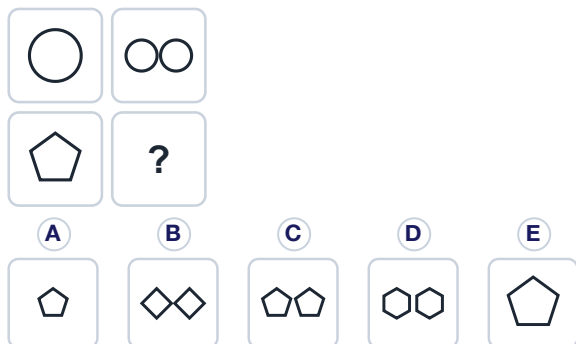
