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Q	Answer	How to get it
1	E	In each step the first letter moves forwards 2 and the second letter moves forwards 2. So the next pair is MO.
2	C	In each step the first letter moves forwards 2 and the second letter moves backwards 2. So the next pair is KP.
3	B	In each step the first letter moves backwards 2 and the second letter moves forwards 2. So the next pair is CU.
4	D	In each step the first letter moves forwards 3 and the second letter moves forwards 3. So the next pair is MP.
5	A	In each step the first letter moves backwards 1 and the second letter moves forwards 1. So the next pair is NJ.
6	D	In each step the first letter moves forwards 4 and the second letter moves backwards 4. So the next pair is RJ.
7	C	Every letter moves 2 places forwards through the alphabet, so WIND becomes YKPF.
8	B	Every letter moves 3 places forwards through the alphabet, so MOON becomes PRRQ.
9	A	Each letter of FOG moves the same number of places to make KTL. Move each letter of XPD 5 places backwards to get SKY.
10	E	Every letter moves 3 places backwards through the alphabet, so MIST becomes JFPQ.
11	B	Every letter moves 4 places forwards through the alphabet, so FROST becomes JVSWX.
12	E	Each letter of WIND moves the same number of places to make COTJ. Move each letter of MGRK 6 places backwards to get GALE.
13	A	The word NEAT is hidden in "line at".
14	D	The word FORM is hidden in "scarf or".
15	C	The word RING is hidden in "your ingredients".
16	C	The word LAND is hidden in "wool and".
17	E	The word MOST is hidden in "memo stack".
18	B	The word WEST is hidden in "We stood".
19	A	Commence and begin mean almost the same thing.
20	D	Gigantic and enormous mean almost the same thing.
21	A	Drowsy and sleepy mean almost the same thing.
22	C	Grasp and hold mean almost the same thing.
23	B	Odour and smell mean almost the same thing.
24	E	Seldom and rarely mean almost the same thing.
25	D	The others are all spring flowers. A spanner is a tool.

26	B	The others are all flowing water. A cathedral is a building.
27	C	The others are quiet ways of speaking. A whistle is not speech.
28	D	The others are worn on the feet. Gloves are worn on the hands.
29	A	The others are kitchen appliances. A comet is in space.
30	E	The others are baby animals. An acorn is a seed.
31	D	Each number is double the one before. The next number is 80.
32	C	Each number is half the one before. The next number is 6.
33	B	The gaps grow by one each time. The next number is 19.
34	E	Double the last number and add 1. The next number is 63.
35	A	The gaps are the odd numbers 3, 5, 7, 9, then 11. The next number is 37.
36	D	Each number is 9 less than the one before. The next number is 52.
