Answer sheet with explanations

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Q	Answer	How to get it
1	A	In each step the first letter moves forwards 2 and the second letter moves forwards 2. So the next pair is IU.
2	C	In each step the first letter moves backwards 3 and the second letter moves forwards 3. So the next pair is MP.
3	B	In each step the first letter moves forwards 3 and the second letter moves backwards 2. So the next pair is SL.
4	D	In each step the first letter moves backwards 1 and the second letter moves backwards 1. So the next pair is HL.
5	E	In each step the first letter moves forwards 4 and the second letter moves forwards 4. So the next pair is RU.
6	E	In each step the first letter moves backwards 2 and the second letter moves forwards 1. So the next pair is KL.
7	A	Every letter moves 2 places forwards through the alphabet, so BOOK becomes DQQM.
8	D	Every letter moves 3 places forwards through the alphabet, so CHART becomes FKDUW.
9	C	Each letter of GLUE moves the same number of places to make KPYI. Move each letter of GPMT 4 places backwards to get CLIP.
10	B	Every letter moves 3 places backwards through the alphabet, so TABLE becomes QXYIB.
11	A	Every letter moves 5 places forwards through the alphabet, so BREAK becomes GWJFP.
12	B	Each letter of GYM moves the same number of places to make MES. Move each letter of RGH 6 places backwards to get LAB.
13	E	The word ITCH is hidden in "bit chilly".
14	D	The word OMEN is hidden in "come next".
15	C	The word ACHE is hidden in "extra cheese".
16	E	The word FLEA is hidden in "chef leant".
17	D	The word STAR is hidden in "first argument".
18	A	The word OVEN is hidden in "drove near".
19	C	Repair and mend mean almost the same thing.
20	B	Famished and starving mean almost the same thing.
21	A	Cunning and sly mean almost the same thing.
22	C	Tremble and shake mean almost the same thing.
23	E	Fatigue and tiredness mean almost the same thing.
24	B	Annually and yearly mean almost the same thing.
25	D	The others are kinds of book. An envelope holds a letter.

26	C	The others are parts of the leg. A thumb is on the hand.
27	B	The others are meadow flowers. A chimney is part of a house.
28	D	The others are ways of sleeping. A gallop is fast running.
29	A	The others are kinds of poem. A beaker is a container.
30	E	The others are bodies of water. A pebble is a small stone.
31	C	Each number is double the one before. The next number is 144.
32	A	Each number is half the one before. The next number is 10.
33	D	The gaps grow by one: these are the triangle numbers. The next number is 28.
34	E	Double the last number and take away 1. The next number is 145.
35	B	They are the prime numbers in order. The next number is 13.
36	C	Each number is 25 less than the one before. The next number is 100.
